The First American Dendrochronology Conference - AmeriDendro 2008 - is intended for academics, scientists, students, and managers interested in tree-ring research and its application in climatology, environmental sciences, archaeology, geology, resource management, conservation, policy, and society. The primary focus of the conference is on tree-ring research in North and South America, but studies from other areas of the world are welcome. We encourage presentation of works-in-progress, innovative directions, and controversial topics, and we especially encourage young scientists to present at the meeting.

The conference registration fee is C\$220 for students (C\$200 for members of the Tree-Ring Society or the Canadian Dendrochronological Society) and C\$300 (C\$260) for all others. Accommodations will be in UBC's Gage Towers, with several budget-minded lodging options available to encourage student participation. There also will be several optional field trips and the conference is being held in conjunction with the 18th Annual North American Dendroecological Fieldweek, to be held the week before the conference.
